Y5/6 Spellings: (Look in your reading log)	Conjunctions: (a word used to connect clauses or sentences – Subordinating or Co-ordinating)
Punctuation:	Noun phrases: (A noun phrase is a phrase which contains a noun, described by 1 or more adjectives).
DTOS (different types of sentences):	Adverbials: (adds to the verb – gives more detail to the clause)
Openers (adverbial, simile, preposition, conjunction):	Link paragraphs (conjunctions, adverbs of time/place, pronouns, synonyms):
Relative clauses: Relative clauses use the relative pronouns who, that, which, whose, where, when. – e.g “Mr Greed, who has a messy beard, teaches year 5.”)	Prepositional phrase: (A prepositional phrase is a group of words consisting of a preposition, its object, and any words that modify the object – e.g. around the bend – after the brutal fight)

Modal verbs: (Examples of modal verbs include can, could, may, might, must, shall, should, will and would. They show the possibility, obligation, and emphasis)	Passive voice The passive voice is used to show the person or object that experiences an action rather than the person or object that performs the action.
